## Description

Provide a short description of the event and its activities.

UMF organised a series of events directed to various audiences in Wrocław, Poland between October 2022 and January 2023 related to the main theme of "Difficult Heritage" with the key event - the conference on 12 October 2022. The series included:

- 1) Heritage City Walk 1: Jewish Wrocław and its non-sites of memory, 08.10.2022.
- 2) Heritage City Walk 2: Jewish art collections in Borek district, 09.10.2022.
- 3) The conference: "Difficult Heritage. Jewish Breslauers and Other Local Stories, Contexts and Activities" with 3 guided tours of "Three Earths" artwork at Gwarna Street for conference participants, 12.10.2022.
- 4) Meeting with students of Sociology at the Institute of Sociology, University of Wroclaw: "Working with Difficult Heritage an NGO perspective", 10.01.2023.
- 5) Two lectures for Erasmus+ students at the Jewish Studies, University of Wroclaw: a) hybrid lecture "Non-places of memory. Polish necrotopography from the perspective of the Zapomniane Foundation", 20.01.2023 and, b) in person lecture on working with sites of difficult heritage with guided tour of "Three Earths" artwork at Gwarna Street, 24.01.2023.

The events raised awareness and knowledge among participants about definitions and places of difficult heritage - focusing on Jewish heritage - in Wrocław, in Poland and in Europe. The series of meetings enriched the network of contacts, fostered relations with new partners - especially cultural, educational and academic - and raised the visibility of UMF and NeDiPa among local communities. Different participants took part in the series of events and participants were not counted twice in the event series statistics.

Every event was organised in such a way that space was left for participants to share their questions, remarks and ideas. This approach resulted in collecting questions during Q&A sessions, which enriched the event and left UMF with new ideas for future actions.

## October 2022 events

The main, almost 9 hours long, event was a multidisciplinary conference entitled: Difficult Heritage. Jewish Breslauers and Other Local Stories, Contexts and Activities. It took place on Wednesday, 12.10.2022 in Ibis Styles Hotel in Wroclaw. The decision to host the conference in this venue was taken after careful consideration and was preceded by market research. The hotel is adjacent to the Jewish cemetery on Gwarna which is at the centre of UMF's advocacy for commemoration in Wrocław. This helped participants to visit the site during guided tours and realise that places of difficult heritage might surround them and be invisible in the urban space.

The event was divided into 3 parts and these parts were further broken down into 8 sessions, which together covered the conference's main topic from all the different points of view: academic & historical, local activism and urbanism. All voices were included.

The goal of the Foundation was to introduce transparency to the DHRF process and reach a broader audience.

The goals of the accompanying programme were: to provide participants with historical context, to raise awareness and (in case of guided tours) to promote the main event.

## January 2023 events

January events were a follow up of the topics discussed during the conference with the main goal to reach a larger number of students based in Wrocław.

One meeting took place at the Institute of Sociology and gathered students willing to enhance
their knowledge about local activism, work with difficult heritage and career paths available for
graduates of the Institute. The additional value of the event was an invitation to organise similar
events in the pear future.

Title: Meeting with students of Sociology at the Institute of Sociology, University of Wroclaw: "Working with Difficult Heritage - an NGO perspective". Date: 10.01.2023.

Speakers: Agnieszka Jabłońska (UMF), Wiktoria Morawska (PhD student at the Polish Academy of Sciences and volunteer at UMF)

- Two meetings were organised for the foreign students, Erasmus+, of the Jewish Studies at the University of Wrocław:
  - A hybrid academic lecture: the lecturer connected online with a group of students gathered in person in a classroom and presented works of the Zapomniane Foundation, challenges and needs of researchers and activists in their field work. The event helped the students to understand local and national conditions of working with places of difficult heritage and to compare these conditions with the ones present in their countries of origin. Title: "Non-places of memory. Polish necrotopography from the perspective of the Zapomniane Foundation". Date: 20.01.2023. Speaker: Aleksandra Janus, PhD (Zapomniane Foundation)
  - A guided tour around Gwarna district and "Three Earths" artwork by Anna Sachapiro allowed participants to grasp challenges awaiting researchers and activists advocating for commemorative actions, as well as to understand the need to listen to voices of all the stakeholders. The participants learned about the approach and practical tools that the local activists can use in their daily work with places of difficult heritage. Speaker: Agnieszka Jabłońska (UMF). Date: 24.01.2023.

The participants of all the events were among others: residents of Wrocław, high school students, university students, researchers, teachers and educators, neighbours living in the vicinity of Gwarna cemetery, journalists, local activists, guides, representatives of municipality.

3 participants from outside of the EU took part in the events - 2 residents of the USA and 1 of Ukraine.
